WELTEVREDE

Since 1912, the Jonker family has called Weltevrede home. Klaas Jonker, the man behind the estate's founding, was a visionary who planted the region's first vines. His son Japie Jonker received Weltevrede in the 1930s, and he started growing wine there in 1933. To meet the increasing grape production, Japie increased the size of the Weltevrede winery. The original vines that the estate's founder planted can still be found at Weltevrede today. The fruit of these vines, a representation of a blessed family history firmly entrenched in the origins of Weltevrede, has been enjoyed by five generations of Jonkers.

Nearly just as much as the soil itself, Weltevrede loves the family experience and the close-knit sharing of the soil's feel. Each vine,

each delectable grape berry, and each succeeding wine are built on this anchor of Weltevrede, which is rooted in time itself. The soils of the Weltevrede vineyards are drastically diverse, despite being adjacent to one another and having sharp changes from one to the next. On Weltevrede, there are 72 distinct vineyards, some of which are smaller than half a hectare. They can be broadly categorised into three separate soil types, or terroirs, including alluvial soil, rustcolored limestone, and shattered shale rock.



WELTEVREDE

THE MOST BIODIVERSE PLACE ON EARTH

More plant species can be found in the Western Cape than in the entire northern hemisphere of the world.

At Weltevrede, vegetation and fauna that are rarely seen elsewhere flourish. The biodiversity's full extent is still unrecorded, although it is known to include a profusion of fragrant herbs and floral gems. The wide selection

of soil types produced the plants that surrounds Weltevrede. This variety of soils offers a variety of terroir that may allow wines to reflect their unique personalities. When Philip Jonker started making wine at Weltevrede, he set out to produce wines of the highest calibre that would serve as representatives of the Robertson Valley and South Africa as a whole. Weltevrede began receiving numerous accolades at global events.

BOSMAN HERMANUS

As you ascend the Hemel-en-Aarde Pass, leaving the crowded beaches far below, the pristine wine valley will gradually immerse you in silence and wonder. Turn left in the direction of the De Bos dam, and after a bend, a low-lying structure that is anchored beneath a sizable tree and perched on a vast landscape can be seen on the horizon. This is the Frame House.

A wooden structure housing the wine tasting venue belonging to Bosman Family Vineyards, on their farm in the Upper Hemel-en-Aarde Valley, Hermanus. The Bosman Family have been vine growers in Wellington for 8 generations, their proud heritage forming the bedrock from which innovation and sustainability are a natural progression.

PAARDENKLOOF WINES

THE WINE TOURISM DIVERSITY AWARD

Paardenkloof Estate, a truly captivating property and home to a number of reserve wines, indigenous fauna and flora, stands by its slogan of "Be Captivated by Nature".

The estate prides itself on its dedication, attention to detail, and passion for giving guests a unique experience at its vineyard's gorgeous riverbank. With the property perfectly positioned near the riverbank, it contributes immensely to the

conservation of various fauna and flora in its surrounding area. This includes animals such as grey buck, duikers, hares, porcupines, snakes, mongooses, meerkats, otters and caracals, as well as an astonishing diversity of birds. Alongside the production of premium matured Shiraz, Cabernet Sauvignon, Pinot Noir and Sauvignon Blanc wines, PaardenKloof boasts wild horses roaming free, and has also reintroduced a herd of indigenous Nguni cattle to the property.

KLEIN GOEDERUST

THE AUTHENTIC SOUTH AFRICAN EXPERIENCE AWARD

In 2019, the Klein Goederust Winery was acquired by Paul Siguqa, making it the first 100% black-owned wine farm in Franschhoek. After acquiring the 116-year-old vineyard, Siquga immediately began the renovation process, transforming the dilapidated, historic buildings into a beautiful boutique wine farm. Siguqa always had dreams of becoming a farm owner, having grown up in the Franschhoek area and watching his



mother work as a labourer on a farm for many years. He has since named the farm's premium sparkling wine after his mother, Nomaroma Siguqa. Klein Goederust prides itself on its excellent service, with attentive and energetic staff always ready to give the most authentic and positive experience.



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TANAGRA

WWF CONSERVATION PIONEER AWARD

Tanagra is an idyllic and peaceful wine farm close to McGregor, part of the Robertson Wine Route and Route 62, tucked snuggly away into the mountains. Producing an exclusive range of handcrafted and environmentally friendly wines, their vineyards are small blocks more than 20 years old, surrounded by wild fynbos, creating highly aromatic wines using traditional farming

methods helping retain the biodiversity of the farm. An old wild fig tree gave the farm its name, 'Tanagra' - it echoes the Khoisan expression for a well-shaded place. This giant tree canopies the historic homestead and winery, providing shade while guests can get a picturesque view of the beautiful landscapes, mountains and sunsets.
